

Waterdance Supply List

The sun or moon; water or the sands of a desert – which will you choose? This pattern can be interpreted in several distinctly different ways. In any way, however, the *value* of the fabric will be important in making the overall results sing. This pattern uses a freezer paper appliqué method to construct this fiber art piece. The finished size of the quilt will be 19" x 57".

Fabric Suggestions:

- 20" square piece of fabric for behind the sun or moon.
- Fabric for the sun or moon (fat quarter is fine).
- A variety of fabric for water (or desert) - fat quarters are fine. Make sure you have values from very light to very dark.

Supplies:

- \$16 Waterdance Pattern
- Heavy Duty Freezer Paper (available at most grocery stores)
- Thread: Invisible Thread in Smoke or Clear (I prefer the Madeira brand)
- 50 or 60 weight medium value thread for the bobbin
- Iron, Small Ironing Pad and Spray Starch
- Scissors to cut paper and fabric
- Mechanical Pencil
- Masking Tape
- Digital Camera (optional)
- Sewing Machine in good working order (must be capable of doing a zigzag stitch)
- Sharp Sewing Machine Needles in size 60/8 (preferred) or 70/10 (also called Microtek Sharps)
- Extension Cord
- Compass Points and small ruler (optional – to create the circle)
- Basic Sewing Supplies (seam ripper, pins, etc.)
